Advent: It's all about waiting

No one likes to be kept waiting and this year, there has been *a lot of waiting*. Waiting is the albatross that lurks and hangs on all of our necks – most especially when we do not have much time or need to be somewhere else. Waiting in line, online or even near a line can be a cause for upset or frustration. Even the



word "traffic" causes immediate anxiety for many people, with empathy for those involved in a car accident (the cause for the delay) can be lacking.

In Advent we wait, too. You do not see or hear about the lines as much, but we wait nonetheless. We wait to greet our newborn King each year and welcome him with abundant hearts. And we wait for His final coming again when the world's wrongs will be made right. Although Advent waiting is a different kind of waiting, it is extremely serious, yet joyful at the same time. The wait in Advent is not dreaded, but an exciting one filled with hopeful expectation.
