This weekend, Aug. 4-5, I will be finishing my yearly retreat which I began last Monday, July 30. An annual retreat is strongly recommended (and even required) of priests of the Archdiocese of Newark so that they take the time needed to renew and strengthen their relationship with the Lord so that they are truly focused on the way that the Lord is leading them. It needs to be a quiet time, away from the daily aspects of their ministry, spending time in prayer and reflection on how God has called them, to listen to the quiet voice of the Lord within.

Even if it were not required, I believe that most priests would go on an annual retreat anyway. That time is crucial to our lives as priests so that we are constantly aware of what God is asking us to do in our particular ministry, whether that be parish ministry, hospital ministry, school ministry, prison ministry, or any other ministry in which a priest might be involved.

Last week, in my column, I spoke of how the Lord called the Apostles to "...come away and rest." They had just returned from preaching the word, from healing, and from other aspects of the work to which the Lord Jesus had called them. Jesus wanted them to reflect on their experience of proclaiming the Gospel and of interacting with the people to whom they ministered. Even in the midst of their enthusiasm at being involved in the work that Jesus had begun, Jesus knew how important it was for them to stop, to pause, and to think about what they had done and how they had impacted the lives of the people whom they had served.

If we consider Jesus' life and work as recorded in the Gospel, he did the exact same thing that he wanted the Apostles to do. He paused and spent time in prayer before making any significant decisions or taking on any important area of ministry. Let's consider these particular times of prayer and reflection for Jesus.

Before he was baptized by John and before he began his preaching ministry, the Gospels remind us that he spent forty days in the desert. That time must have been a period of prayer and reflection, seeking his Father's guidance as to the direction his life would take. We are told that, before he chose the 12 Apostles from among the larger group of disciples, he spent time in prayer, discerning who would be the "inner circle," so to speak, the ones who would ultimately be the first leaders of the new Christian community, the ones to whom he would explain in a special way the message that he wanted to preach to the people.

We heard two Sundays ago in the Gospel how he called the Apostles to come away to a quiet place. It's not that he didn't want to be with the people; it's that he realized how important it is from time to time to pause and reflect on the direction that our lives are taking. We know that, before his arrest and execution, he went to the quiet of the Garden of Gethsemane to pray to his Father, asking for the strength needed to endure what was to come.

It is difficult for many of us to take a week or even a few days to re-focus, to reflect on the relationship that we share with the Lord, with our families, with our co-workers, with our neighbors, and with any other significant people in our lives. Here at OLBS, we seek to have (and will again have) a periodic morning or weekend when we take even a few hours to *get off the merry-go-round*, to stop and to see how everything is going in my life and if I'm on the right track. Family commitments, work commitments, and other key aspects of our lives pull us in different directions and it's often difficult, if not impossible, to get that quiet time that we want and which we need.

Perhaps this year, we can find a way that fits, not only our schedules, but also our needs, and to find that time, perhaps even a short time each day, to pause, to reflect, and to discern how God is calling us to a deeper relationship with him and with the significant people in our lives.

REQUEST FOR PAPAL BLESSINGS

If you have a special event coming up in your own life or in the life of your family, e.g., wedding, 25th wedding anniversary, special birthday, you may want to request a Papal Blessing to mark the occasion.

The blessings can come from either the Vatican itself or the Vatican Embassy in Washington, D.C. **Please note the following guidelines:**

- 1) The individuals named in the blessing must be practicing Catholics.
- 2) Only one blessing can be obtained per person.
- 3) If requested from the Vatican, the blessing should be requested 4 months in advance of the occasion. The cost is \$45.00.
- **4)** If requested from the Vatican Embassy in Washington, D.C., the blessing should be requested 2 months in advance. The cost is \$20.00.

IS YOUR MARRIAGE VALID?

If you were married civilly, that is not in the Catholic Church before a priest or deacon, *it might not be a valid marriage*. Some couples believe that a marriage before a Justice of the Peace or a non-Catholic minister is valid. For a marriage to be valid in the Catholic Church, the marriage must be in a Catholic Church or Chapel and officiated by an authorized Catholic priest or deacon along with 2 witnesses. (There are limited interfaith exceptions with proper permission.)

We invite you to speak with one of our priests if there are any questions or if, indeed, you wish to validate your marriage. The process can be very simple and your marriage will now be blessed by the Church.
