Music sung during Mass in the early days of the church was very different from what we usually hear today. In those days, a single melodic line, sung in unison and sometimes in Latin, was the music used to sing the Mass parts. It was called Gregorian chant, named after Pope Gregory I.

During our Masses in the Lenten season, we will be singing our acclamations using that same Gregorian chant, the music of the early church. Some of you may already know the Kyrie, Alleluia, Sanctus, Mysterium fidei, Amen and the Agnus Dei. We will sing these acclamations in English and many of you will recognize these melodies that were often sung in churches before the reforms instituted by the Vatican II Council between 1962 and 1965. Next week, I will introduce the chant version of the Holy, Holy (Sanctus).

Sing and make music from your heart to the Lord.

Saints Children Should Know



The following list suggests a few amazing men and women that children may want to get to know. It is always fun to look up the saint that you are named after and celebrate your "name day". For instance, the church feast of Saint Michael is held on Sept. 29, and as a result the name day for Michael is on Sept. 29th. It is a wonderful reason to celebrate and let the children plan a party. Here are a few saints who kids may be excited to learn about:

- The Virgin Mary: She is an easy one for kids to get attached to. After all, they already know their Mom from even before they were born. Introducing them to our Blessed Mother is the next
- St. Joseph: He's the strong silent type, but his actions will speak loudly for any kid, especially boys. He listened to God's call, protected his family, and took care of a son who was not biologically his own.
- St. Francis of Assisi: While he has a lot of other great things going for him, St. Francis is best known by children for his love of animals. If they have a pet, St. Francis is great to pray to when they are sick or injured. His dramatic life as a soldier and the son of a rich merchant, who gives up everything to serve God, is also universally inspiring.
- St. Peter: St. Peter is not only the first Pope, he's a Pope who is really easy to relate to. He is headstrong, he doubts, and he isn't the most learned of men. But God works through him (in fact, builds the whole Church upon him), and he can work through your kids, too!
- St. Joan of Arc: Show me a girl who is not awed by St. Joan's courage. She was young girl leading armies and willing to give her life out of love of the Lord.
- St. Medard: If you haven't ever heard of him, you aren't alone. But this saint is the patron saint of thunderstorms because an eagle once protected him from a storm. So, if you have a kid who is afraid of storms, St. Medard is your man.
- Mother Teresa: Getting to know a modern-day saint is a great idea, because saints aren't just historical figures from long ago. Share your own memories of Mother Teresa, show them video clips, photos and more as an example of someone who went against society's expectations and cared radically for her neighbor.
- St. Thomas Aquinas: While the Summa Theologica might be above their head, understanding that our Catholic Faith is completely reasonable is an important lesson for their spiritual life. They can pray and ask for the intercession of St. Thomas before tests or other difficult school assignments.
- St. Anthony: Who could forget the patron saint of lost things? Whether it's a toy or a lost homework assignment, St. Anthony is a friend we can always count on when we lose something. "St. Anthony, St. Anthony please come round, something is lost that must be found".
