

Streams in the Desert



Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf unstopped; then the lame shall leap like a deer, and the tongue of the speechless sing for joy. For waters shall break forth in the wilderness, and streams in the desert. —Isaiah 35:5-6 [NRSV]

Lent comes early this year and it partners well with the bleakest time of the winter season when all appears grey and cold. Snow and ice are still trying to befriend us as we pray to keep them at baby, counting our prayers answered each day as the light stays with us a little longer.

No matter where we live, the season of Lent comes to us each year beckoning us to heed her call and to delve deeply in the desert. It is there we find our truer selves and it is through this experience in the arid land that we see God's hand in our lives made visible through the persons, places, and things sent either to accompany us on our journey or to challenge us to live a life more deeply centered on Him.

The Scripture is filled with images of the desert – of wanderings and sufferings and abandonment. Jesus meets his own demons in the desert and it is there we see His strength made manifest in the way hope comes alive in us when all else seems to fail.
