

Dear Parishioners,

Why don't we sing the Gloria at Sunday Mass during Lent? The main reason is because the Gloria is a joyful hymn that celebrates the birth of the Lord, as sung by the angels at Jesus' birth ("Glory to God in the highest and on Earth peace to people of good will!") During Lent, the Church returns in spirit to a time when God's people were in exile, waiting for the Messiah to come and save them. Instead of awaiting Christ's birth from the womb of Mary, in Lent, the Christians await Christ's second "birth" from the tomb. So our focus in Lent is not in rejoicing, but in repenting our sins, acknowledging our moments of weakness and failures and looking at those things that prevent us from an authentic relationship with God. Eventually, we will once again experience the joy of worshiping God as the angels did and return to singing the Gloria during Mass on Holy Thursday when the Triduum (three days) begins.
