

"He who sings, prays twice"

Why do Catholics sing? The answer to this question is found in instructions from scripture and from the church. Psalm 96 includes this directive, "Sing to the Lord a new song; His praises in the assembly of the saints." St. Paul tells us in Colossians, "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly...singing psalms, hymns and spiritual songs with gratitude in your hearts to God." It was St. Augustine who said, "We are urged to sing a new song to the Lord…a song is a thing of joy; more profoundly, it is a thing of love."

These days, the congregation sings at various times during the Mass, but it was not always this way. In the earlier years of the Catholic Church, the singing was reserved to a trained choir, known as a schola cantorum. The Second Vatican Council changed that in the 1960's by calling for full and active participation of the congregation in the liturgy, both spoken and sung. Today, we are all asked to sing in celebration and in prayer: it is our task, our job in the liturgy, to join our voices together!

The impact of COVID-19 on food insecurity has had a major impact on many families. Households that experience food insecurity lack access to enough food for an active, healthy life for all household members.


