MUSIC MINISTRY MINUTES


Palm Sunday is the last Sunday in Lent before the Triduum, and it commemorates Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem. As he rode into the city on a donkey, his followers spread **palm** branches at his feet and called him "Hosanna" or "savior."

Palm branches were considered symbols of victory and triumph at that time. The word Hosanna is derived from the Hebrew word **Hoshana** and can be translated as Savior, Save, Rescue or Please Save Us. (The word Hosanna and its variations appear in the New Testament six other times.) So, how did the glad shouts of "Hosanna" turn to angry cries of "Crucify Him" in a matter of days? For that matter, how can we go from singing the jubilant "All Glory, Laud and Honor" at the opening of our Palm Sunday Mass to leaving the Mass in silence; a silence filled with personal reflection?

It is in the Gospel read on Palm Sunday we find our answer. Musically, our gathering hymn is joyous, reflecting the entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem, but it is after we have listened to the passion, our mood, and our thoughts, become more somber. We might leave the Mass thinking, what have I done, how could this be...why? Music at this point would only be a distraction. Silence, at times, can be much more powerful than music, so this is the perfect time to refrain from singing, to be alone with our thoughts, to engage in deep reflection and prepare ourselves for our Triduum journey.
