

Music Ministry Minutes "He who sings, prays twice"

Memorial Day, originally called Decoration Day, is a day of remembrance for those who have died in the service of the United States of America. It is celebrated on the last Monday in May. Memorial Day was borne out of the Civil War (which ended in 1865) and a desire to honor our war dead. On the 5th of May in 1868, General John Logan who was the national commander of the Grand Army of the republic, officially proclaimed in his General Order No. 11, "The music we associate with Memorial Day is Taps". Taps is a bugle call, which is a signal, not a song. There is a popular myth about the origin and history of Taps: in July 1862, after the Seven Days battles at Harrison's Landing (near Richmond), General Daniel Butterfield reworked, with his bugler Oliver Wilcox Norton, a bugle call for Lights Out, or Taps, and it became so popular that even a few Confederate units began using it as well. Since then, Taps is often played at funerals and burials of military Veterans. Here at OLBS, buglers still play the familiar mournful tune before they present the folded American flag to the family.

Even though it is a bugle signal, many started putting words to Taps. There are no "official" words to Taps but the most popular Taps Lyrics are below:

Day is done, gone the sun,

From the hills, from the lake, from the skies.

All is well, safely rest, God is nigh.

Go to sleep, peaceful sleep, may the soldier

or sailor, God keep. On the land or the deep, Safe in sleep.

Fades the light;

And afar Goeth day,

And the stars Shineth bright,

Fare thee well;

Day has gone, night is on.

Thanks and praise, for our days,

'Neath the sun, Neath the stars, 'Neath the sky,

As we go, this we know, God is nigh.
