Msgr Hynes had the piano moved to its present location by removing some of the pews, and that is where it now sits, ready to be played again during our masses. Each time it is played, I am reminded of my sister Louise, her love of music and her precious gift to our parish.

Catechesis Corner



"Then children were brought to him that he might lay his hands on them and pray. The disciples rebuked them, but Jesus said, 'Let the children come to me, and do not prevent them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these. "Matthew 19:13-14

This is one of my favorites, a beautiful verse with a powerful message. To Jesus, children were wonderfully precious. He did not push them away as too young or insignificant. Quite the contrary, Jesus welcomed them to be close to him, to listen, to receive his love and grace. In the same way, the beautiful sculpture in our own vestibule of Jesus and the children represents these verses perfectly, with the eager faces of the children seated with our Lord as he prayed over them, laying his hand upon their little heads...what a blessing they received that day!

Pope Francis recently wrote to young people in **Christus Vivit**, "Christ is alive and he wants you to be alive! He is in you, he is with you...he calls you and waits for you to return...he is always there." In the same way Jesus gathered the children around him in the verses from Matthew, our Holy Father reminds our youth, and all of us, that Jesus is always waiting so he can welcome us to his side to listen to his Word, to receive him in the Eucharist, to open ourselves to his mercy and grace.
