My brothers and sisters in the Lord,

As we bring the Christmas season to a close today as we remember the Baptism of the Lord, we are truly grateful to all those who were such a significant part of our Christmas liturgies. That included so many of our parishioners: a) those who read at Christmas Season Masses or ministered the Eucharist to the people of God here at OLBS, 2) those who raised our minds and hearts in praise of God as together we sang the familiar Christmas carols, 3) those who cleaned and decorated the church so beautifully, 4) those who welcomed our parishioners and our guests to pray with us, 5) all who came to rejoice in prayer as we celebrated the first coming of the Lord and his revelation to all nations of the world.

In all likelihood, Christmas decorations will soon come down and gifts will be put away. As a Church community, we now return to the liturgical season we call *Ordinary Time*. This time of the Church year sadly has a name in English which does not adequately explain what this season is all about.

For us, the word *ordinary* often means routine, even boring or dull. That is not its meaning for the Church. The term *ordinary* which describes the season to which we now return, comes from the Latin word which means *number*. Therefore, this season called *Ordinary Time* simply denotes the fact that our Sundays are now *numbered*, e.g., the 1st Sunday or the 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time. During this season, we highlight, not specific events in the life of Jesus, such as his birth, his dying and rising, his sending of the Holy Spirit, but rather the message of Jesus that we will hear Sunday after Sunday in the readings proclaimed at Mass, especially the Gospel reading.

We will hear of his healing, his forgiving, his challenge to the self-righteous, his time spent teaching the people, whether on a hillside in Israel or at a dinner table in someone's home. We will focus on Sunday as the single most important day of the year, the Lord's Day, a fact that our society has forgotten due to a variety of activities in which families are now engaged. It is never bad when families spend time together. Time spent together strengthens the bonds that unite family members. However, when the day has nothing to do with thanking the Lord for what God does for us each day, for celebrating the Eucharist together as part of a faith community, the day and its meaning are significantly diminished.

We are now into the second and final phase of our church renovation. The original font is now in plac and very soon, the lower font will be in place as well as the ambry where the sacred oils will be kept. The men who have worked so hard on our renovations are to be congratulated for the fine work that they have done. The pews have been beautifully re-finished, we now have new kneelers (*Please don't put your feet on them or stand on them!*), the floors – in the church, in the sanctuary, in the vestibule – provides a warmth to our time together. *During these winter months, to the best of your ability, please wipe your shoes on the mats in the vestibule to prevent moisture and mud from being brought into the church.*

All of this work, and the beauty that it offers to us, is possible only through the generosity of those who have donated to these renovations in any way. Without their willingness to support what we are doing, this work, and the joy that it brings with it, would never have been possible. When we come together, there is nothing that we cannot do for the praise and glory of God and the uplifting of our hearts and minds to the Lord.


Sunday Evening Mass


