

Detergent Pods: A Serious Safety Hazard



Risks to our children's safety come in many shapes and sizes. As parents and caring adults inappropriate adult conduct is not the only risk to watch for; we must also create safe environments to protect our children from other risks.

According to a recent study published in The Official Journey of Pediatrics, laundry detergent pods (as well as dishwasher pods) are one thing that we should strongly consider avoiding. If used, they must be kept out of reach of children or in a childproof container.

While they may be more convenient then conventional detergents, these pods are far more concentrated and, therefore, much more toxic. Of the children affect, 70% were under the age of three.

It is easy to see why a child would be interested. Toddlers and babies are attracted to a bright liquid detergent pod tempting them to bite it to see if it is candy or juice.
