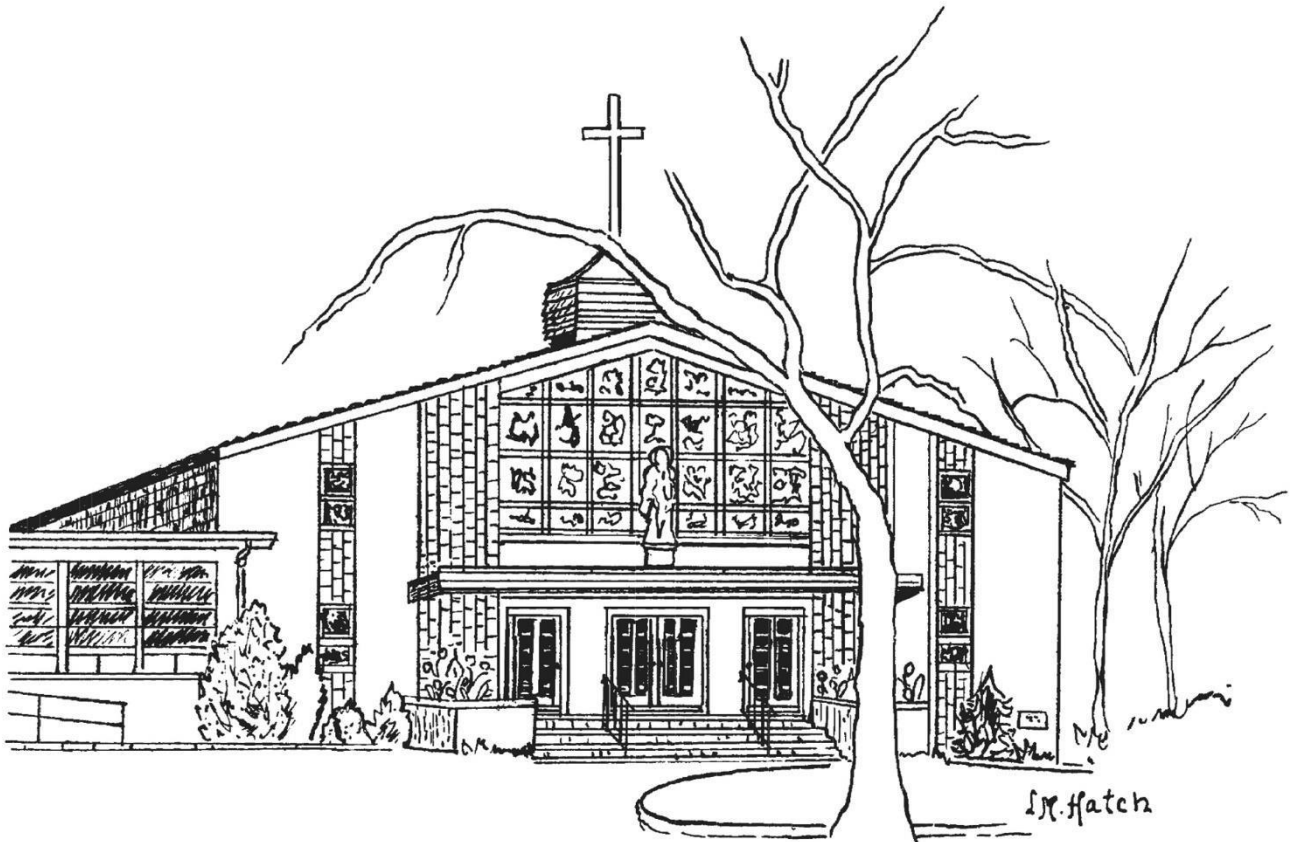

Ministry & Parish Groups

As a parish community, we, at **Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament**, take the message of the Lord Jesus seriously and seek to live out the Gospel each day as individuals and as a community of faith. One way in which the Gospel is lived is through our active involvement in the mission and ministry of OLBS Parish.

Since the Second Vatican Council in the 1960's, members of the laity in the Catholic Church have realized and rejoiced in the recognition that, by virtue of their Baptism, they are called to become active members of their local faith community through participation in parish ministries, committees and societies.

This listing is intended to give all of our parishioners an overview of the various ministries, committees and societies that are a vital part of the life of our parish. We invite all of our parishioners – newcomers and “veterans” alike – to look through this listing and see how God may be inviting you to share your time and talent with the parish, to become Stewards of OLBS.

This listing is divided into four cluster groups: [Word, Worship, Community Building and Service](#). The ministries within the [Word](#) cluster recognize that we proclaim the word of God from the pulpit and in a classroom as well as various other means. [Worship](#) ministries involve parishioners in our communal prayer and worship at Sunday or daily Mass. As a parish, we recognize that we are brothers and sisters in the Lord, united one to another. Our [Community Building](#) ministries and committees strengthen those bonds of unity through social interaction. Last but not least, we as a parish are committed to care for one another. Through our [Service](#) ministries, we seek to reach out to those in need, both within the parish and “beyond our walls.”

Please pray that you will be open to the many ways found in this listing through which the Lord may be inviting you to become a Steward of Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament, a person willing to donate your Time and Talent to our parish community.

WORD CLUSTER

Baptismal Family Outreach

Baptism outreach members visit families that are having their baby baptized and bring a packet of information about Baptism and about OLBS. Team members also assist at the Masses where children are baptized. They are asked to visit one family a month on average and to assist at Mass every few months.

Baptismal Garment Makers

During the rite of Baptism, a small white garment is placed over the person being baptized as a sign that they have “put on Christ,” that they have risen with Christ. The garment is embroidered with a cross to signify the redemption that Christ won for us when he died. At OLBS, these garments are made by parishioners so that the initiation of the newly baptized is much more personal. The sewing and embroidering is done by individuals in their homes whenever their schedules allow.

Religious Education Catechist

The OLBS Religious Education Program is in place so that all of our parish children attending public school may receive age-appropriate education and formation in our faith in grades 1-8. Classes meet on Sunday morning, Monday afternoon & evening and Tuesday afternoon for 60 minutes. Men and women from our parish volunteer their time to share their faith and to teach our children what we believe about God and the Church. We provide a training program that helps those who volunteer to fulfill their ministry as catechists.

Faith Sharing Group

During Advent and Lent, when the Church calls us to reflect more deeply on our baptismal calling, our parishioners have the opportunity to participate in a faith sharing group. This group, comes together to reflect upon the Scriptures, especially on the following Sunday's readings; to share faith stories; to pray together and to offer mutual support in deepening their own faith lives. Although each group is unique in its membership, style and format, each group reflects on the Sunday Scripture readings or on various spiritual themes.

Pre-Cana Team

Engaged couples, intending to marry at any Catholic parish in the Archdiocese of Newark, are required to attend a formation program in preparation for their wedding. This program is offered once a year at OLBS in the spring. Married couples in our parish present talks, based on their own lived experience, on a variety of topics related to Christian married life. Time is provided for couples to share with each other and to reflect upon some important aspects of their future lives together. Married couples in our parish are invited and encouraged to consider becoming part of the Pre-Cana process in different and important ways.

Lectors

At every Sunday and daily Mass, men and women proclaim the readings taken from the Word of God, the Scriptures. This ministry allows those who attend Mass to hear God's word so that they may be nourished to lead the Christian life more fully and to be comforted by this gift from God. Readers receive proper preparation before they proclaim God's word at Mass.

These ministers allow those who come to Mass to receive not only the Body of Christ, but the Blood of Christ as well. Ministers receive appropriate preparation in order to minister the Eucharist with dignity and respect.

Greeters

We always want those who come to worship with us to feel welcome, therefore, we have begun a new ministry here at OLBS. Music Ministry

Altar Servers

Adults and children alike are invited to become altar servers, assisting the priest who is celebrating Mass. For children, those in the 4th grade and in upper grades are invited to become altar servers. Usually, boys and girls act as altar servers at Sunday Masses, while adults usually serve at daily Masses or funeral Masses.

Altar Servers (Funerals)

Because our funerals generally take place during the morning hours, our regular altar servers cannot serve since they are in school. We rely on the help of adults who are usually free in the mornings and can serve at a funeral. Liturgy of the Word with Children

Since it may be difficult for young children, up to the 5th grade, to understand the readings and homily at Sunday Masses, children at our 10:00 Sunday Mass are invited to go to the school for a celebration of the Lord's word, presented at a level that they can more easily understand. Liturgy/Spirituality Committee

A group of parishioners, interested in deepening the communal worship of our parish, come together with the pastor and staff members involved with preparing for our worship to offer their input and suggestions for ways in which our celebration of the Eucharist and the sacraments can be enhanced. Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

The RCIA is the process through which adults are fully initiated into the Catholic faith community. Those who would like to become a Roman Catholic, that is, adults who have never been baptized as well as those who have been baptized into another Christian religion, participate in this process. The RCIA process is also open to baptized Catholics who have not yet received First Communion and/or Confirmation and who have received little or no formal religious instruction. Those who become catechumens (the unbaptized) or candidates (baptized Christians) meet on a regular basis with team members who assist them on their spiritual journey. Those who want to be a part of the RCIA team “walk” this journey of faith with these adults and share their own faith with them.

Parish Pastoral Council

This body consists of men and women of the parish who comes together 5-6 times per year. Parishioners become members of the Parish Pastoral Council through a process of prayerful discernment. The entire parish nominates men and women whom they believe will best serve the parish in a position of lay leadership. They are essentially a consultative body to the pastor. However, their primary

role is to be the "dreamers" of the parish, committed members of this faith community who seek to formulate a vision for our parish. They look at the mission of the parish, as given to us in the Gospel message of Jesus, and determine ways in which we are called to live out that mission in our particular area of Essex County and beyond. They also listen to the parishioners of OLBS who seek to bring their concerns to light so that they can be discussed and addressed.
